**Subject:- Grant of conditional permission to Shri Lal Bahadur Shastri Smarak Rajkiya Ayurved Govt.College, Jawahar Nagar, Handia, Prayagraj-221503, Uttar Pradesh (AYU0250) with intake capacity of 39 seats (49 seats including EWS) [instead of 60 seats (75 seats including EWS)] in UG (BAMS) under section 28 of the NCISM Act, 2020 for the academic session 2023-24 and relevant regulations thereunder in respect of appeal dated 15.09.2023 -reg.**

Sir/Madam,

With reference to the subject mentioned above, I am directed to inform you that in pursuance of the provision of National commission for Indian System of Medicine Act, 2020, the Indian Medicine Central Council Act, 1970 (48 of 1970) has been repealed with effect from the 11th day of June, 2021. With effect from the said date, the Central Council of Indian Medicine constituted under sub-division (1) of section 3 of the Indian Medicine Central Council Act, 1970 (48 of 1970) shall stand dissolved. Now, in exercise of the powers conferred by sub-section (3) of the section 1 of the said Act, the Central Government hereby notifies that all the provisions of the National Commission for Indian System of Medicine Act, 2020 has been come into force with effect from the 11th day of June, 2021.

1. This is with reference to your first appeal filed by the Director, Ayurved Services, Government of Uttar Pradesh vide ref.no: **1174/22-23 dated: 15.09.2023** to the Commission for reconsidering the reduction in number of UG (BAMS) seats in conditional permission issued to **Shri Lal Bahadur Shastri Smarak Rajkiya Ayurved Govt.College, Jawahar Nagar, Handia, Prayagraj-221503, Uttar Pradesh (AYU0250) with intake capacity of 36 seats (45 seats including EWS) [instead of 60 seats (75 seats including EWS)] in UG (BAMS)** due to non fulfillment of the basic eligibility criteria in terms of Regulation 3 of the "Indian Medicine Central Council (Requirements of Minimum Standard for under-graduate Ayurveda Colleges and attached Hospitals) Regulations, 2016" and provisions under the NCISM Act, 2020 and relevant regulations thereunder and other shortcoming as mentioned in the permission vide letter of even number dated 25.08.2023.
2. Thereafter the said appeal was placed before the Chairman, NCISM and the Chairman NCISM constituted a Hearing Committee to provide an opportunity of hearing to the aforementioned college. Accordingly, the letter was sent to the Director, Ayurved Services, Government of Uttar Pradesh vide Commission's letter dated 29.09.2023 to appear before the designated hearing committee as constituted by the Chairman, NCISM on **03.10.2023** in respect of appeal to the reduction in number of UG (BAMS) seats in conditional permission issued to **Shri Lal Bahadur Shastri Smarak Rajkiya Ayurved Govt.College, Jawahar Nagar, Handia, Prayagraj-221503, Uttar Pradesh (AYU0250) with intake capacity of 36 seats (45 seats including EWS) [instead of 60 seats (75 seats including EWS)] in UG (BAMS)**, filed under section 10(1)(g) and section 24(3) of the National Commission for Indian System of Medicine ACT, 2020 and to produce all relevant valid documents/records/ proof to substantiate the claims and make written submission and submit an authenticated copy of evidence/verifications to commission with shortcoming wise clarifications mentioned in the seat reduction permission letter dated 14.08.2023 passed by the Medical Assessment and Rating Board for Indian System of Medicine, NCISM. The proceedings of appeal were held virtually on **03.10.2023 at 11.30 AM** and on behalf of the college, **Dr. Vinod Kumar Singh, Principal and Dr Ritu Raj Tripathi, Department of Rasashastra and Bhashajya Kalpana** attended the hearing.
3. The hearing committee sought clarification from the, **Dr. Vinod Kumar Singh, Principal and Dr Ritu Raj Tripathi, Department of Rasashastra and Bhashajya Kalpana, of Government Ayurvedic College & Hospital, Chaukaghat, Varanasi- 221002, Uttar Pradesh (Inst. ID AYU0258)** regarding the conditional permission with seat reduction in PG Courses issued by Medical Assessment and Rating Board for Indian System of Medicine, NCISM, vide letter of even number dated 14.08.2023 which is as under:-

Dr. AnandChaurasiya (AYDG01337) (Department of Dravyaguna) has been promoted to the post of reader but due to technical error, we are unable to change his designation on portal and same has been communicated to the NCISM through email as well as telephonically.

Dr. AnandChaurasiya (AYDG01337) Department of Dravyaguna promoted to the post of Reader/ Associate Professor 1LF shortcoming persist **Submission considered.**

Availability of total teaching staff on the day of visitation was 26 and considering the joining of Dr. Niharika Mishra

Dr. Niharika Mishra (Sanskrit Teacher) has joined back after her contract renewal.

Availability x 100% 27/30 x 100= 90%

**So, submission considered.**

Prof, Avadhesh Kumar Singh (Department of Shalakyia Tantra) joined this college on 05/07/2019 and after his suspension on dated 15-12-2022, teaching and other departmental work are being carried out by Department of Shalya Tantra.

**Now the availability of total teaching staff for UG is 20**

As we stated earlier that this college is governed by Govt. of Uttar Pradesh, therefore all matters regarding recruitments/ appointments/ postings/ transfers are made by higher Govt. officials. Request to fulfil the mentioned posts as per NCISM norm has been sent to higher authorities and procedure of recruitment is under process as per guidelines of Govt. of UP. (Annex-05)

4. The submissions made by **Dr. Vinod Kumar Singh, Principal and Dr Ritu Raj Tripathi, Department of Rasashastra and Bhashajya Kalpana, Shri Lal Bahadur Shastri Smarak Rajkiya Ayurved Govt.College, Jawahar Nagar, Handia, Prayagraj-221503, Uttar Pradesh (AYU0250)** and observations of the hearing committee was placed before the Chairman, NCISM and it has been decided by the Chairman NCISM to partially consider the appeal of the Director, Ayurved Services, Government of Uttar Pradesh **dated 15.09.2023 by considering 01 faculty in the department of Ayurveda Samhita & Sidhanta in Shri Lal Bahadur Shastri Smarak Rajkiya Ayurved Govt.College, Jawahar Nagar, Handia, Prayagraj-221503, Uttar Pradesh (AYU0250) under section 28 of the NCISM Act, 2020 for the academic session 2023-24.**

5. In view of the above, the college is fulfilling the **basic eligibility criteria for issuance of conditional permission for UG ( BAMS) Course under section 28 of NCISM Act 2020 for the Academic Session 2023-24 as per the approved Seat Reduction Policy in accordance of Section 28 (1) (f) of NCISM Act 2020 for failing to maintain the minimum essential standards for the Academic year 2023-24, wherein it is mentioned that:-**

a. "For deficiency of **every one teacher**, seat reduction in the intake capacity shall be considered by reducing the intake strength by 5 % of total intake capacity."

Accordingly as per Schedule-V Note (iii) of MSR 2016 the deficiency of teacher for up to sixty intake capacity shall not exceed more than ten percent of total requirement. As per the Hearing Committee observation, college is having only 20 total eligible Teaching faculty.

There is deficiency of 07 teachers for issuance of Conditional Permission for academic session 2023-24 as per Schedule-V Note (iii) of MSR 2016. **Therefore, in accordance of Reduction policy 2023-2024, for deficiency of every one teacher, seat reduction in the intake capacity shall be considered by reducing the intake strength by 35% of total intake capacity.**

Hence, after applying the seat reduction policy 2023-24 under section 28 (1) (f) of NCISM Act 2020 college is fulfilling the basic eligibility criteria for issuance of **conditional permission with 39 seats (49 seats including EWS) [instead of 60 seats (75 seats including EWS)] in UG (BAMS) course for the academic session 2023-24 under section 28 of NCISM Act, 2020.**

5. Hence, it has been decided by the President, Medical Assessment and Rating Board for Indian System of Medicine, NCISM to issue conditional permission to **Shri Lal Bahadur Shastri Smarak Rajkiya Ayurved Govt.College, Jawahar Nagar, Handia, Prayagraj-221503, Uttar Pradesh (AYU0250) with intake capacity of 39 seats (49 seats including EWS) [instead of 60 seats (75 seats including EWS)] under section 28 of the NCISM Act, 2020 for the academic session 2023-24 and relevant regulations thereunder and in compliance of the direction received in the letter no. NCISM/Comm./OPT Appeal/(2023-24)-(U.P) dated 20.10.2023 by the Chairman, National Commission for Indian System of Medicine, subject to following condition:-**

i. It is further informed that minimum 15% of undergraduate seats of the permitted intake capacity **with 39 seats (49 seats including EWS)** shall be treated as All India Quota. The counseling for seats under All India Quota shall be conducted by respective counseling authority as designated by Central Government for A.Y. 2023-24 and

counseling for the remaining 85% seats or as the case may be, shall be conducted by the concerned counseling authority of that State/UT. **The permission of the college stands withdrawn if the college fails to comply with the aforesaid direction of the Central Government/NCISM for All India Quota or the students admitted thereunder.**

7. Admissions made in violation of the above conditions will be treated as invalid and action will be initiated under NCISM Act & Regulations thereunder.
8. Further, **as per Sub-section (7) of Section 29 of NCISM Act, 2020**, The Medical Assessment and Rating Board for Indian System of Medicine may conduct evaluation and assessment of any University or medical institution at any time, either directly or through any other expert, having integrity and experience in medical profession, without any prior notice and assess and evaluate the performance, standards and benchmarks of such University or medical institution and if the college is found to be not maintaining the Minimum Essential standards as specified in the concerned Acts & Regulations then **in accordance of Section 28 (1) (f) of NCISM Act, 2020 the issued permission of the college shall deemed to be withdrawn and denial of permission shall be issued by MARBISM for stoppage of admission for that particular academic year or the subsequent year.**
9. Discrepancies, if any, may be immediately brought to the notice of Medical Assessment and Rating Board for Indian System of Medicine, NCISM.
10. The following requirements should be fulfilled by the college by **31<sup>st</sup> December, 2023 and send a compliance report to get permission for the session 2024-25:**
  - (i) All the requirements of Minimum Standard of infrastructure and teaching & training facilities as specified in Regulation 3 of the "Indian Medicine Central Council (Requirements of Minimum Standard for under-graduate Ayurveda Colleges and attached Hospitals) Regulations, 2016;
  - (ii) All the requirements of the Indian Medicine Central Council (Minimum Standards of Education in Indian Medicine) Amendment Regulations, 2016 (for Ayurveda);
  - (iii) All the requirements under the provisions of the NCISM Act, 2020 and relevant Regulations made thereunder should be fulfilled in toto.
11. The fulfillment of the conditions given above may be made within the time period specified and compliance report should be submitted by the college to President, Medical Assessment and Rating Board for Indian System of Medicine. The Medical Assessment and Rating Board for Indian System of Medicine will verify that the conditions have been fulfilled for considering the permission for the academic session 2024-25.
12. **Further, the letter issued vide letter of even no. dated 25.08.2023 stands withdrawn.**
